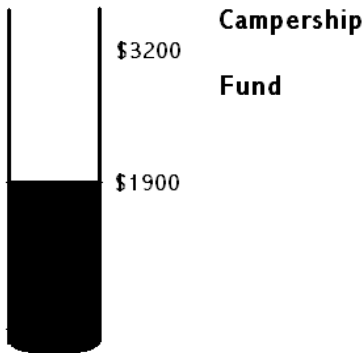


America For Christ Missions
