That gave sweet song to birds.

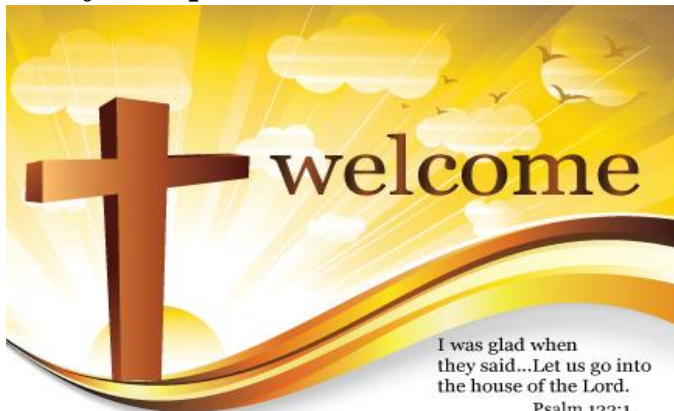
He gave to force the wisdom wise
